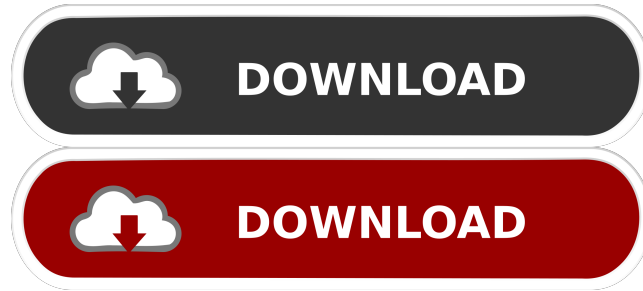

"In each of the past three decades, the U.S. economy has been rocked by a deep downturn. In 1983, the U.S. endured its worst economic crisis since the Great Depression, and in 2008 the financial crisis caused a massive drop in economic activity. The latest crisis, which began in the autumn of 2007, has resulted in a truly historic downturn. The recession officially ended in June 2009. At the time, unemployment was more than 10% (10.5%), and the economy had shrunk by more than 7% (7.7%) of its previous size. The United States is not yet out of the woods. However, a marked recovery in 2010, which coincided with the Obama administration's successful efforts to reduce the budget deficit, meant that the government was able to "ring-fence" spending in areas such as unemployment insurance, health care, defense, and education. This allowed the recovery to continue at a relatively robust pace. On top of this, in October 2011, the U.S. government began to ease the conditions on its borrowing by allowing the Treasury to postpone its payments on government debt for the first time since the Great Depression. In 2014, the federal debt actually shrank for the first time in history. The burden of debt on the U.S. economy has had a knock-on effect, as most of the rest of the world has experienced its own contraction. This has led to a significant drop in world trade, which, in turn, has had a detrimental impact on the U.S. manufacturing industry. This is most evident in the automobile industry, which has been one of the most important sectors of the U.S. economy since the 19th century. Over the past 30 years, the United States has seen a continuous decrease in the share of production that takes place in the country. To this day, the United States has the second-largest automobile industry in the world, accounting for just over 10% of global production. That share has now dropped to less than 5%, and it is expected to continue to shrink to 1.5% by 2020. Moreover, the total number of motor vehicles in the country is the lowest it has been in almost 50 years. The U.S. produced nearly 27.3 million vehicles in 2016, down from more than 30.5 million in 2005. For the industry to maintain its position as one of the two
